Trip Committee Report

The 7-day, March 5th –12th trip to **Breckenridge** was hosted by **Dave Mueller**. Overall, skiing conditions were excellent, with a mix of spring and winter weather. Look for Dave's article on pages 3 and 9.

The day trips to New York update is:

March 13, 2011 – Holiday Valley (Bill Nappi) – The trip had 33 skiers. See Bill's article on page 7.

Overall, I feel that our ski trips were a success for this season. We had three western week trips, and three daytrips to New York and Pennsylvania. While the final accounting isn't in, I believe that in total about 214 people went on our trips, and the trips were operated so that only a very small surplus or loss was generated. Thanks to all the skiers who joined us in the fun this season.

Your trip committee continues looking at trips for the 2011-2012 ski season. We have made arrangements with the Timken Ski Club for joint trips next season, which should improve our success rate on the day and weekend type trips, while offering new locations and more day and weekend trips that we offered this past season. The number of available seats will be approximately halved as a result of the joint trips (an overwhelming response could be handled by an additional bus). Next season though, you may not want to wait quite as long to decide on ski trips, as we will likely only have half of the normal amount of seats to fill on many of the day and weekend trips offered. We have made an arrangement with the Cleveland Metro Ski Council to "adopt" their March Trip as our own. Our March 2012 trip will be to Big Sky, Montana, March 17-24. GSC has requested 28 seats, has asked for Akron-Canton Airport, and will have a GSC Trip Leader. Look for full trip details much later; probably in the June or July newsletter.

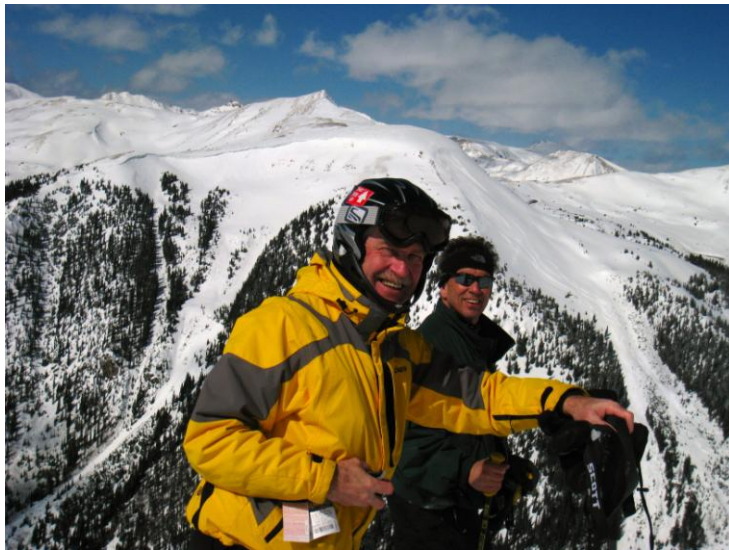

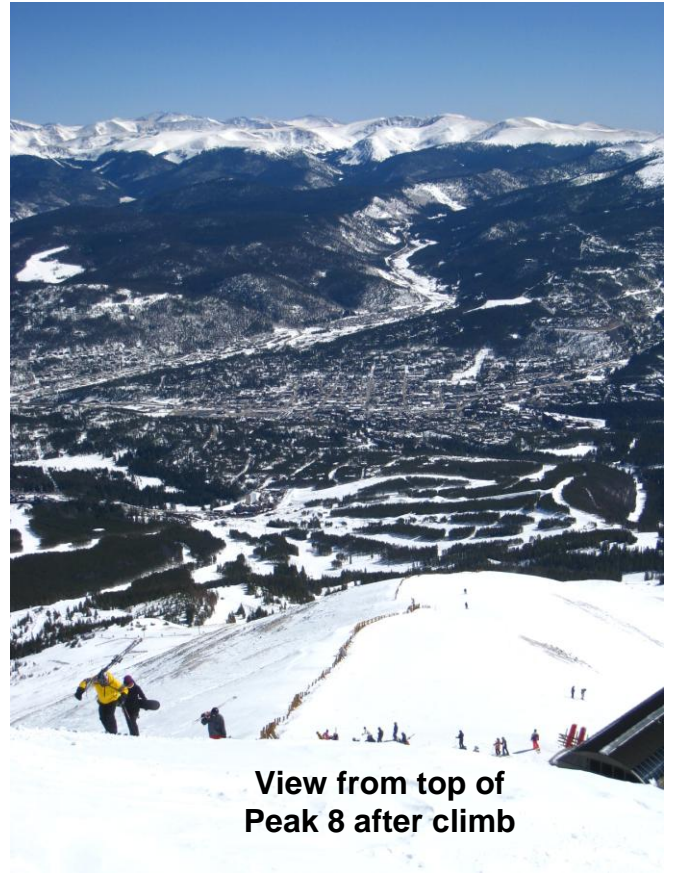
