# Park City Utah Trip

## JANUARY 8-15, 2011

Saturday morning was like many January mornings in Akron - cold and snowy. Twenty-six (26) members of the Goodyear Ski Club met at the Akron-Canton airport to head to Park City, Utah. Two other members would join us later: **Charlie Kamke** (flying out of Dayton, OH) and **Jerry Mills** (flying out of West Palm Beach, FL). All went well until we boarded the plane. Anxiously waiting for our departure, we soon found out that our plane had a frozen toilet from sitting on the tarmac overnight in single digit temperatures. As such, our departure was delayed an hour. But thanks to Frontier Airlines burning extra fuel, and holding in Denver the flight for Salt Lake City, we landed within five minutes of our scheduled time -- and not a single piece of luggage was lost. What a miracle!

In no time we were loading our bags on the express bus, and on our way to the Peaks Hotel where we were staying. Our bus driver must have watched the movie Speed, or was a frustrated want-to-be NASCAR driver, for he didn't let too many vehicles get past him.

We were all thankful in many ways that we got to the hotel in record time. First of all, we weren't in an accident, and most of us wanted to take advantage of Park City's Quick Start program. It allows you to ski free, at any of the three area resorts, on the first day that you fly into Salt Lake. All you need is to bring to the lift ticket window a copy of your boarding pass, a photo ID, and a copy of the online registration form. It is simple enough to do!

Things were really going smoothly for our group. We were at the hotel by 11:30AM. Believe it or not, all our rooms were ready. People scurried to their rooms to rid themselves of their luggage. Most changed into their ski gear to get a half-day of FREE skiing. **Linda and I, Warren and Judy Ripple, and Roger Carmany** opted for a quick lunch at the hotel before changing and taking the bus to Park City Resort.

Although I emphasized several times prior that if you want to get your free lift ticket, one has to bring to the ticket window a copy of the Quick Start registration form off the internet, I must confess that I left mine and Linda's registration forms back in the room. I forgot the old adage . . . "Haste makes waste." At least Linda didn't say anything as I made a hasty retreat back for our documentation while she enjoyed a cup of coffee with **Betty Wise**. But I wasn't the only one . . . right **Helga**? We did get out and enjoyed a few hours of skiing. The worst part was getting ragged on from **Dave Mueller, Bill Nappi, and Randy Grether** about my faux pas later that evening at the wine and cheese party, hosted by the hotel's Maxine Jensen.

Sunday was the most uncomfortable day. It was cold, damp and cloudy. Roger, Linda and I stopped around 10:30AM to get something hot to drink at the Mid Mountain Restaurant at Park City. We were soon joined by new members **Sue and Roger L' Hommedieu, Mary Beth Dombrosky** and **Randy Grether**, also looking for some warmth. Although cold, the skiing was great and brought us fresh snow for Monday along with clear skies.

On Tuesday, we were to have a guided tour with Maxine at Canyons (no longer known as "The Canyons"). She had booked two tours that day and had another commitment. However, she arranged to have an employee of Canyons, Michael, to give us a tour. On the first run of the day, we got to the top of the mountain, and Michael said, "Akron, show me what you've got." That was the wrong thing to say. Without a warm-up run, many of our intrepid skiers took the challenge to heart, proceeding to charge down Eclipse, a blue run. It has a moderately steep pitch, but about two-thirds of the way down it transitions into a much steeper grade, much to the surprise of **Charlie Kamke**. Charlie fell and couldn't get up on his leg. **Scott and Kathy Wertz** skied over to the nearby Sun Lodge to contact the ski patrol, who then transported Charlie down the mountain. He fractured the upper part of his tibia. He is doing well. Knowing Charlie, he will be back next January with the Club skiing. He flew out early Wednesday morning back to his home in Dayton, where he had surgery.

# Copper Mountain Trip - Feb 6-11, 2011

On Sunday, February 6, twenty-one (21) anxious skiers waited at the gate for several hours due to light snow and air traffic congestion in Chicago. The delay was long enough to cause us to just miss our connecting flight in Chicago to Denver. Then, the scramble started. I was talking to Karl Winter after he found that we missed our connections. Since it was Super Bowl Sunday, seats were found on a flight to Dallas/Fort Worth with a connection to Denver. I guess everyone that wanted to be at Dallas was already there for the Super Bowl. We did fly over the Super Bowl, which I am sure was a treat for several of the skiers dressed in Steeler garb. When we landed at Dallas, we exited the plane with about 30 minutes before our departure. Luckily, our next leg was departing from the same gate. Little did we know that it was the same plane we had just left. Once we landed in Denver, we went to the baggage claim as directed only to find our luggage outside the United baggage claim office with the skies locked in the office. Our luggage had beat us there. Thankfully no luggage or skies were lost in all the changes. We loaded the bus and left for Copper. Our bus driver suggested stopping at the Safeway in Frisco, rather than Apple Jacks, because he thought that liquor store would be open. However, since it was around 8:30 PM Sunday night local time, it was closed. We finally arrived at Copper central reservation office at 9:00 PM about 4 hours later than planned. We missed watching the Super Bowl at a local bar, but the bus driver did let us listen on the radio during the trip. I thought the fans in their Steeler garb in the back of the bus were very quiet. I was glad that the Packers won since it is hard to rout for Pittsburgh because they beat up the Browns too much. From the central desk, we were taken to the Village Square Condos in Center Village. We were treated to a great breakfast, allowing choices from a great variety of eggs served several ways, pancakes, omelets, cold cereal, fresh fruit and even yogurt. Breakfast beverages were included. After breakfast, **Michelle Bodnovich** and I went back to the condos to "sleep off" the effects of a cold and altitude. The comments from the people who did the mountain tour were very positive, saying they have never been treated so well on any other mountain tour they had done. In my conversations with several of the ambassadors, I found them to be very friendly, courteous, and helpful. Monday night, twelve of us ventured to the Double Diamond Restaurant in the East Village. We were treated to great food at very reasonable prices by the owner himself, David Luthy.

Tuesday morning we woke to sun and blue skies, along with double-digit temperatures. However on Wednesday and Thursday, the sun helped the single-digit temperatures be bearable. On Thursday, my condo-mates were joined by **Al Santa**, **John Vorhies**, and **John Fiehn**. John Fiehn conducted a ski clinic for us, including human gates. The 7-day March 5<sup>th</sup> –12<sup>th</sup> trip to **Breckenridge**, hosted by **Dave Mueller**, is now filled thanks to Pete Wells! Dave has finalized most of the trip plans and a ticket party was held Sat., Feb. 26<sup>th</sup>.

**The overnight and day trips to New York and Pennsylvania updates are:**

Jan 21, 2011 – Peek'n Peak ipo Holimont (George Csepegi) - Originally the bus and trip members were headed for Holimont, but some bus mechanical problems stranded the bus near Peek'n Peak. A detour to Peek'n Peak followed. See the writeup on article on page 1.

Jan 30, 2011 – Seven Springs (Warren Ripple) - The bus took 43 skiers to Seven Springs for a Sunday of skiing pleasure. # Goodyear Ski Club, Inc (GSC) Trip Agreement / Release and Trip Application Form (7/7/10)

Unless otherwise noted, all prices are "per person". All trip reservations require a signed application with payment.  
Make all checks payable to the Goodyear Ski Club, Inc.

**CANCELLATION AND/OR CHANGES:** GSC reserves the right to: (1) withdraw the trip; (2) refuse, at any time, to accept or retain any person as a trip participant; and/or (3) prior to departure, make changes in published itinerary, whenever, in its sole judgment, conditions warrant.

**ROOMING PREFERENCES:** Due to the nature of our trips, the number of participants, the bedding configuration, and the accommodations secured for the trip participants, the GSC cannot guarantee that the requested rooming preference will be provided.

**SINGLE SUPPLEMENT CHARGES:** Room rates are based upon double occupancy. If you are a single participant, without a roommate preference, every effort will be made to find you a roommate. If that is not possible, you will be required to pay any single supplement charges that may be imposed.

**RESPONSIBILITY:** GSC is acting as the applicant's agent and will not be liable for any loss or damage to baggage or property, or any personal injury, or any other loss occurring or occasioned by applicant's participation or lack of participation in a trip. GSC will not be responsible for any cost increase(s) due to increases in local, state, or federal taxes; fuel surcharges; baggage fees; etc. Any participant under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

**REFUNDS:** Applicant will receive a full refund if the GSC cancels a trip, except and unless such cancellation is necessitated or caused, either wholly or in part, by applicant's cancellation or failure to make timely payment. 1) Where applicant cancels at any time and trip departs 100% filled, the applicant may be entitled to a refund, less a \$5 service charge on any one-day trip; a \$15 service charge on any weekend trip; or a \$25 service charge on any trip over three days. 2) Where applicant cancels and a trip departs less than 100% filled, the applicant may be liable for the entire cost of the applicant's trip, including deposit, final payment and/or balance due. 3) Applicant shall be liable to the GSC for any monies expended or paid by GSC over and above payments made by the applicant to the GSC.

**RELEASE:** In consideration of being permitted to participate in trip activities, by signing the application, I, as an individual hereby release the GSC, its officers and agents, from all liability for injury, death, damage or loss resulting from such participation. I understand the dangers inherent in trip activities and acknowledge that I have had an opportunity to make all necessary inquiries regarding the transportation and facilities involved. I release the GSC to use my likeness which may appear on their website to publicize their ski trips, which may appear in their photo albums or which may appear in other media used to publicize the GSC and its activities. I intend this release to be binding on my heirs and personal representatives. If I am the parent or legal guardian of a trip participant, I intend the above release to be applicable to the participant, as well as to me.

**FUEL SURCHARGES:** The GSC may not have been notified of any additional fuel surcharges to the contracted transportation at the time this release was prepared; but, an increase can occur at any time before trip departure. It is the responsibility of the participant to pay any such increases. Participants having any questions regarding this policy should contact their trip leader.

**NSF CHECK:** For any check returned for insufficient funds, the participant will be assessed a \$25 minimum return check fee, plus any daily penalties incurred by the GSC. The return of any check will be cause for cash payments to be made to the GSC Treasurer. If checks are returned for insufficient funds, the Treasurer shall notify the participant and allow him/her fourteen (14) days to cover the check. If funds have not been paid within the fourteen day period, the member may lose his/her position on any GSC trip or activity.

**POST-DATED CHECK:** No post-dated check(s) will be accepted for any GSC trip.

**TRIPS OUT OF THE COUNTRY:** You must have a current passport, which does not expire until 6 months after your return. If you have been convicted of a crime, including D.U.I., you may be refused entry into the subject country and should contact the country's embassy or Consular General for the proper procedure or clearance. The GSC is not responsible for the denied entry.

**ASSOCIATE MEMBER:** To protect the GSC's non-profit status, each non-member is charged an Associate Membership fee based upon a non-refundable fee structure of: \$5 for each one day trip; \$10 for each weekend trip; and \$25 for any trip longer than three days. This fee allows an individual to participate on a current season ski trip. Within one month from the ending date of the respective trip, the Associate Membership fee may be applied toward a full membership. The fee does not entitle the Associate Member to receive the monthly newsletter or any other GSC benefits. The Associate Membership fee will be in effect only after a trip is opened to non-members.

**NOTE: NOT INCLUDED** – Any items not specifically mentioned as part of the trip, such as: meals, phone calls, transportation to the point of trip departure, items of a personal nature, fees charged for airlines for checked baggage, etc. are the sole responsibility of the trip participant.
